

Armenia <i>Customs Information</i>	
<i>Documents Required</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Detailed inventory, including values ➤ All electronic and electrical appliances, along with their serial numbers, should be clearly marked on the packing list ➤ Copy of Passport
<i>Customs Regulations</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ The consignee should be present at destination and should have a valid visa. ✓ The consignee should be employed by a registered company in Armenia.
<i>Motor Vehicles</i>	<p>Required documentation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Purchase invoice ➤ Car title ➤ Certificate that auto meets technical specifications and is in good running order ➤ Auto must have been used abroad and show signs of use.
<i>Pets</i>	<p>The importation of pets is allowed, and the following documents are required:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Vaccination certificate ✓ Veterinary certificate ✓ Passport of the pet ✓ Photographs
<i>Prohibited Items</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Firearms ➤ Pornographic materials ➤ Drugs and narcotics ➤ Toxic or Radioactive materials ➤ Export of antiques such as carpets, paintings, books, icons or any other items, which are considered to be of Armenian cultural or historic value. <p>Note: Precious jewelry, stones and currency can be imported only as accompanied baggage and must be declared with the customs authorities at the airport at the time of arrival. The declaration should be kept in safe custody because the same will be required for presentation to the customs authorities at the time of departure.</p>
<i>Duty</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Import of household goods and personal effects to Armenia is subject to payment of import customs duties, fee and VAT. ✓ All import duties are charged on C & F (cost and freight) value. ✓ Duty approximately 30.3% of value as declared by customs.
