<b>Documents Required</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Passport</li> <li>✓ Residence Visa</li> <li>✓ Customs Bond</li> <li>✓ Bank Guarantee</li> <li>✓ Proof of Employment</li> <li>✓ Declaration stating that all imported goods have been used prior to their import</li> <li>✓ Inventory</li> </ul>
<b>Customs Regulations</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ CUSTOMER MUST BE IN COUNTRY PRIOR TO ARRIVAL OF GOODS FOR CUSTOMS CLEARANCE.</li> <li>➤ All shipments inspected.</li> <li>➤ Shipments must arrive within six months of Customer.</li> <li>➤ Used household goods are duty-free if owner is a returning citizen who has been outside Malta for over 18 months.</li> <li>➤ Foreign nationals taking up temporary residence or having a Work Permit, may import their used household goods duty – free, but a cash guarantee must be lodged with customs authorities which is refundable.</li> </ul>
<b>Motor Vehicles</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ New items are dutiable at 15%</li> <li>➤ Furniture is subject to VAT</li> </ul>
<b>Prohibited Items</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Firearms and weapons are subject to Police License (make, country of manufacture, serial number and specifications required)</li> <li>➤ Drugs and narcotics</li> <li>➤ Alcohol and tobacco products are dutiable at 15%</li> <li>➤ Dish antennas, air band receivers or transmitters require an Import License (must supply make, country of origin, serial number and specifications)</li> </ul>
