

<b>Spain</b> <i>Customs Information</i>	
<b>Customs Regulations</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Returning Spanish citizens with "Cancellation of Residence" can import duty-free if they have lived abroad for more than one year.</li> <li>➤ "Cancellation of Residence" is the only document customs accepts in order to clear items duty-free.</li> </ul>
<b>Documents Required</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Original "Alte de Padron" (Registration form from local Town Hall)</li> <li>✓ Inventory/Packing List</li> <li>✓ Activated NIE (Spanish Tax number and registration)</li> <li>✓ Baja Consular (Confirmation from Spanish Consulate at origin stating that the individual has been living overseas for more than 12 months)</li> <li>✓ Photocopy of Passport</li> <li>✓ Power of Attorney (provided by Destination Agent)</li> <li>✓ Signed "Solicitud de Franquicia" (Duty Free Import Form provided by Destination Agent)</li> </ul>
<b>Motor Vehicles</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Original Title</li> <li>✓ Valid Registration documents from origin</li> <li>✓ Copy of purchase invoice</li> <li>✓ Chassis and license plate numbers</li> </ul> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ The vehicle must have been owned by the customer for more than 6-months prior to cancellation of residence.</li> </ul>
<b>Pets</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Dogs, cats, birds, etc. allowed with Health and Vaccination Certificate from a licensed veterinarian – validated by the Consulate at origin.</li> <li>➤ Additional restrictions may apply dependent upon the origin country.</li> </ul>
<b>Dutiable / Restricted Items</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Guns, Ammunition, and Antiques need a special permit.</li> <li>➤ Large quantities of alcohol</li> <li>➤ Brand New Items</li> </ul>
<b>Prohibited Items</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Drugs and narcotics</li> <li>➤ Pornographic material</li> <li>➤ Perishable foodstuff</li> </ul>
